


DUAL CREDIT PROGRAMS

The purpose of TCC Dual Credit Programs is to improve college readiness and decrease cost and time-to-college completion for secondary students in Oklahoma.

TRENDS: CREDIT HOUR COMPLETION



OSRHE ACADEMIC AFFAIRS POLICY 3.10

Students, entry, and load: Juniors and Seniors. Six semesters beginning with the rising junior summer term with a maximum combined credit hour load of 19 credit hours high school, Tech, plus college with at least one high school level class.

Admission and course placement and persistence:

- 3.0 unweighted GPA <u>OR</u> appropriate ACT product composite (19) or SAT (990) for state accredited and unaccredited high schools admission.
- Unaccredited students (including home-educated) may used national test scores, on-campus ACT (residual) testing, and Accuplacer scores. Additionally, they MUST have equivalent coursework completed to be classified a junior or senior (no age requirement). Accredited students may used national test scores, on-campus ACT (residual) testing, and Accuplacer scores, and unweighted High School GPA for enrollment. Must maintain 2.0 College GPA in order to continue in the program

Tuition waivers: Jrs. 12 cr. hrs. primarily funded by TCC; seniors 18 cr. hrs. primarily funded by state.

Faculty, courses, and assessment: Faculty credentials, professional development, collegiate experience, multiple annual reports.




REMOVING BARRIERS STREAMLINING DUAL CREDIT

- GPA (unweighted HS) to enroll juniors in courses
 - 4 semester transcript
- GPA (unweighted HS) to enroll seniors in courses
 - 5 semester transcript
- Piloting fully electronic automated enrollment
- One processing email enrolldc@tulsacc.edu for all enrollments, adds, drops.
- Virtual office hours- Zoom hours for counselors, students, and parents: link at www.tulsacc.edu/dualcredit
- 600 (reserved high school seats) in 3 delivery modes: classroom, online live, online.
- New 600 (reserved high school seats) rosters with remaining seat availability.

FOUR DUAL CREDIT OPPORTUNITIES



DUAL ENROLLMENT

- No pathway
- Usually a limited number of courses per semester (e.g., Composition)
- Doesn't always use the maximum tuition waivers
- May not be eligible for each type of course (E.g., reading, but not math)
- Encourage to move to High School Plus One Pathway

HIGH SCHOOL PLUS ONE

31 Credit Hour Pathway and half-way to Associates Degree

- E-core 600 section online course option offered each semester with no additional online fee or book charges (except math)
- Choose any 600 section or non-600 section courses -See website for sample pathways
- 30 hours of tuition waived
 - 12 credits for juniors + 18 credits for seniors = 30 hrs. tuition
 - Encourage the 31 hour pathway with the lab science requirement.
 - Students only pay for the I credit hour of tuition for a year of college.
- Non-Cohorted
 - Open to any student that meets eligibility requirements
 - Encourage dual enrollment students to progress to this program level

DUAL CREDIT TO COLLEGE DEGREE (DC2CD) ASSOCIATE DEGREE

- Academically prepared sophomores
- Two Types:
 - HS Partnership- Cohorted
 - Individual students Not Cohorted
- Please send to Dual Credit for HS partnerships, cost, and degree map information
- Admission and Testing begins spring of the 10th
- Usual first college courses: Biology 1383 and College Success 1003
- Uses six concurrent semesters of eligibility
- Partnerships expanding to other districts.

EARNA DEGREE, GRADUATE EARLY (EDGE)

LIBERAL ARTS ASSOCIATE DEGREE

- Free to the students
- Six high school partners: UPS, BAPS, KIPP, SSPS, TPS: McLain, & Memorial
- Focus student populations:
 - 80% under-resourced (OK Promise)
 - First generation college student
- 8th grade application
- 9th grade required student preparation; cohorted for the majority of the program
- Post 9th grade admission and testing
- I0th grade 9 college credit hours; OSRHE Pilot exception for early start
- Inescapable student support ENGAGE

ADMISSION AND ENROLLMENT

ADMISSION ELIGIBILITY (JUST NEED ONE)

| Meet one score or use GPA | Minimum Score |
|------------------------------|----------------|
| National ACT | 19 composite |
| OR Pre-ACT | 19 composite |
| OR Residual ACT ¹ | 19 composite |
| OR SAT | 990 composite |
| OR PSAT 10/NMSQ | 990 composite |
| OR High School GPA | 3.0 unweighted |

ADMISSION

Step I. Go to your high school

- Ask for your "unofficial" high school transcript (electronic version) and your schedule availability to attend college courses (days/times)
- Check your eligibility
- Check with your counselor or <u>dualcredit@tulsacc.edu</u> for the reserved courses for high school students (600 sections)
 - Book and fee programs
 - Transportation

ADMISSION

Step 2. Gather documents

- Locate your social security number
- Save your "unofficial" high school transcript as a PDF on your computer
- Save any test score sheets (ACT, SAT, PSAT 10, PSAT-NMSQ, pre-ACT) as a PDF on your computer

ADMISSION

Step 3. Complete the TCC online college admission application

- Upload your high school transcript and any test score sheets into the online admission form.
- Declare a major (if unsure, declare Liberal Arts/ General Education. You can always change this).
- Provide an email address that you check often. TCC will contact you with next steps.
- If you are notified that you do not meet admission eligibility, you may take an oncampus / residual ACT once you receive your T#.
- If you are notified that you are admitted, you may now check enrollment eligibility.
- One-time \$20 admission fee- charged only with first enrollment.

ENROLL FOR EACH SEMESTER

Step I. Student: Complete a semester enrollment form

- Type to fill in part IA: student information and signatures: student/parent
- Type to fill in part IB: reserved courses for high school students (600 section numbers – see www.tulsacc.edu/dualcredit or search for a course at tulsacc.edu
- Save as a word document and forward the form to your high school counselor or administrator.

ENROLL FOR EACH SEMESTER

Step 2. High School: complete course enrollment form

- Type to fill in part 2A: school information and student academic course load
 - Do not list co-curricular classes (sports, band, etc.)
 - Include all tech program courses
 - Maximum load is 19 credit hours combined load
- Type to fill in part 2B: confirm that the student is on track for high school graduation.
- Forward the enrollment form and student's latest high school transcript to enrolldc@tulsacc.edu

TESTING

Next Steps for Ineligible Students

- New transcript with updated GPA (unweighted)
- National ACT, SAT, pre-ACT, PSAT 10, PSAT-NMSQ
- On-Campus / Residual ACT (once Nov. I Oct. 31)
- Accuplacer Reading/Writeplacer / Accuplacer Math
 - Referrals Advising
- Partially eligible: use the score they have (e.g., reading now, math later)

Processing enrollments, drops, and adds- all to enrolldc@tulsacc.edu

Enrollment communication – auto-response that email was received

Enrollments NOT processed –email response with specific needs for enrollment completion

Enrollment confirmation – TCC student email, MyTCC/MyAccount/View Schedule, and/or counselor weekly enrollment rosters (only after enrollment dates are open)

AFTER ENROLLMENT

Student and counselor support

ENROLLMENT CHANGES AND REPORTS

Drop, Section Change or Add a new course

- Drop or section change only requires student signature
- Add a new course requires counselor signature
 - Fillable word form on webpage
 - enrolldc@tulsacc.edu

Withdraw Request

- Meet with advisors
- Process maker routes to Dual Credit
- Called and emailed (24 hours)
- Only requires student signature

COUNSELOR REPORTS

- Weekly district enrollment rosters
 - 600
 - 100-400
- Weekly schedule change reports (W, D, AW)
 - 600
 - 100-400
- Open seats for all 600 courses
- Weekly early alerts for at-risk students
 - 600 weekly request emails
 - Starfish
- EOT grades
- Faculty letter and Student letter MOU

BURSAR STUDENT ACCOUNTS

Tuition waivers

- Juniors: I2 credit hours (TCC)
- Seniors: 18 credit hours (OK and TCC)
- Applied 3 weeks after drop date
- Automatically applied
- Bursar Student accounts (FERPA)
 - Students pay fees, books, and materials not covered by the high school

 - View online at MYTCC / My Account (no paper bills are mailed)
 - Pay online or at TCC: cash, check, credit cards, payment plans

- Coordinated schedules / availability
- Not dropped for nonpayment
- No zero level courses, audit, or PE courses
- Technology helpdesk: <u>studentsupportcenter@tulsacc.edu</u>
- High School courses are not prerequisites for college courses Ex. high school psychology is not a prerequisite for 2000 level psychology courses.
- On time enrollment means the student needs to attend I st class.
- You may add/drop to a course that has not started yet.
