Tulsa Community College Check List

- Apply for Admission to TCC**
 - www.tulsacc.edu/admission
 - Check personal email for college ID and PIN number
 - Check admissions letter for your TCC email address

- Submit credentials to Enrollment Services**
 - High school transcript
 - College transcript (if necessary)
 - Test scores (ACT/GED scores)

- Meet with a TCC Academic Advisor**
 - Educational Planning
 - Testing referrals
 - Degree audit
 - Graduation check (as needed)

- Complete current FAFSA** (if seeking financial aid)
 - <http://www.fafsa.ed.gov> TCC School Code: 009763

- Log in to TED to view your student account**

(TED link is found atop the TCC homepage, www.tulsacc.edu.)

 - Enroll in courses
 - View schedule
 - Select a payment plan for your student account

- Submit all requested Financial Aid documentation**

(Check TED for any forms needed to process your aid)

 - Check Financial Aid award offer (if seeking financial aid)
 - Complete Entrance Counseling (for student loans only)
 - Electronically sign Master Promissory Note (for student loans only)
 - For scholarship and fee waiver information, check www.tulsacc.edu/scholarships

- Purchase books**

(Financial aid recipients may be able to charge books.)

- Make college photo ID**

(visit any Student Activities Office)

- Pick up parking decal**

(visit any Campus Police Office)

How do I log in to TED?

Start at www.tulsacc.edu; Click on the “TED” link at the top/middle of the page; Choose the first option “TED Self Service”.

Your User ID will be your college-wide student ID which will start with a capital “T” and be followed by 8 numbers.

Your PIN # will start out as your 6 digit birthday (mm/dd/yy). If it is your first time logging in, the system will prompt you to create a new password and three security questions.

How do I log in to MyTCC?

Start at www.tulsacc.edu; Click on the “MyTCC” link at the top/left-middle of the page. Choose the first option “Secure Access Login.”

Your user name is usually your first name underscore last name (Ex: john_doe). Your password will be the same as your TED password.

Once inside your “MyTCC” site you can:

- Check your TCC email
 - Sign up for TCC alerts
 - Learn about Student Organizations
 - Access the Learning Resource Center (LRC) online

OTHER IMPORTANT STOPS WHILE ON CAMPUS

Campus Book Store – In addition to course books, supplies and materials, the Campus Book Store offers a variety of merchandise which includes computer software, snacks, backpacks and an assortment of clothing. The Campus Book Store distributes caps and gowns for commencement and coordinates orders for graduation announcements, rings, and class pins.

Career Services – TCC's Career Services program provides assistance to current students in developing, evaluating, and implementing career, education, and employment decisions over the life span.

Continuing Education – TCC’s Continuing Education Division offers a variety of non-credit innovative and responsive educational opportunities for all ages.

Fitness/Wellness Center – Professional staff members are dedicated to assisting students as they work toward personal fitness goals. A wide variety of fitness classes and wellness services are available to all users.

Learning Resource Center (LRC) – Besides study space, TCC’s library provides students with access and assistance to a variety of information resources, such as books, research databases, newspapers, videos, research guides, and much more.

Student Disability Support – There are two offices that collaborate with academic support services for students with disabilities.
