Tulsa Community College 2021-2022 Exit Survey Report

November 17, 2022



Executive Summary

Each academic year an Exit Survey is offered to all students applying to receive a certificate or degree from Tulsa Community College. The purpose of this report is to present the summary findings of the 2021-2022 Exit Survey, including the general demographics of students completing degrees and certificates during the year.

The Exit Survey (Appendix A) is designed to shed light on the following questions:

- ❖ To what extent do students feel their experience at TCC contributed to their development of broad learning skills, analytical skills, interpersonal/relationship skills, and goal setting?
- How satisfied were students with the educational services and the interpersonal interactions they experienced at TCC?
- ❖ What were students' goals for attending TCC and did they accomplish them?
- ❖ How do students rate their TCC experience compared to other institutions?
- What are students' plans for future education and employment after graduation?

In addition, students were asked to name specific individuals who were especially impactful during their time at TCC and to share additional comments related to their experience at the college.

During the 2021-2022 academic year (Summer 2021, Fall 2021, Spring 2022), 2,869 certificates and degrees were conferred to 2,603 individual students. Of the completing students, 51.4% were 18 to 24 years old and 67.0% were female. Of the degrees conferred, 73.3% of awards were university transfer degrees (Associate of Arts, Associate of Science). Of the students filing for graduation, 1,003 students completed the Exit Survey 2021-2022, representing a 38.5% response rate. The following points are a summary of the major findings from this survey.

- ❖ The majority of respondents strongly agreed that TCC contributed to their development of learning skills, analytical skills, goal setting, and interpersonal/relationship skills. The item receiving the highest percentage of strong agreement was the ability to learn effectively on their own (71.8%). The lowest percentage of strong agreement (49.0%) was associated with contributing to the welfare of the community.
- The majority of respondents (59.6%) believe the instruction they received in major courses was high quality.
- ❖ 48.7% of respondents strongly agreed to the statement "I was able to get involved with organization(s) or event(s) that were of interest to me."
- ❖ 46.2% of respondents strongly agreed to the statement "The programs, organizations, or events in Student Life helped me become a more well-rounded person."
- The majority of students (88.8%) either strongly agreed or somewhat agreed they learned about different cultures, ideas, and/or types of diversity.

- ❖ 93.6% either strongly agreed or somewhat agreed that TCC was inclusive of their thoughts, ideas, and/or identities.
- The top educational goals set for attending TCC were to earn a degree or certificate, transfer to a 4-year college/university, and prepare for getting a job (87.0%, 52.5%, and 22.2%, respectively). 77.4% of students indicated they had accomplished their goal(s) for attending TCC.
- 49.5% of student respondents indicated they had attended another institution.
 - Of students who indicated they had attended another institution, 41.8% believed TCC was better than other institutions they had attended. 53.3% believed TCC was about the same.
- The majority of respondents (96.1%) indicated that if they were to start college over again, they would probably or definitely enroll at TCC.
- Of all respondents, 58.8% of students indicated they would be transferring to a 4-year institution.
- The top four-year institutions identified for transfer were: NSU, OSU, and OU (29.8%, 24.0%, and 10.0%, respectively).
- ❖ 28.3% of students indicated they would begin or continue in a job related to their degree or certificate.
- ❖ The comparison of the average response to scaled items between the 2021-2022 survey and the 2020-2021 survey showed only slight variations from year to year.

Survey Methodology

Beginning the fall semester of 2016, an online graduate application process was implemented. The new process includes a link to the Exit Survey as an option for applicants to complete. The digital version of the Exit Survey was delivered through Qualtrics (see Appendix A). All program graduates were offered the survey link as part of the graduate application process for the Summer 2021, Fall 2021, and Spring 2022 (N = 2,603). A total of 1,003 individuals completed the survey, for a response rate of 38.5%. The summary of responses follows.

Everything was great, except for [name redacted]'s class. Worst experience I've ever had with a college professor and I honestly think she shouldn't be teaching.

Genuinely was really disappointed in the overall experience. I had literally 2 classes that I actually received/retained useful information from, and neither had anything to do with my major. The entire curriculum is set up to reward students for regurgitating information rather than truly understanding the "why" behind it. Sure, it may be helpful to someone who wants to make 50k a year sitting in a cubicle making spreadsheets all day, but for people with greater ambitions, the curriculum is pitiful. There is no sort of critical thinking to be done. There was no emphasis on the importance of interpersonal skills. I had a total of two instructors throughout my entire time there who I felt were "experts" and who I would look to for either general advice or information going forward in life

Honors is mandatory for a quality experience at TCC

I did not expect to be taught education with racist undertones. I rarely came across this til one of my instructors made a blanket statement that anyone with pigmented or darker skin will have more heath issues. I do not agree with statement. I am mixed Korean and my healthiest family lived past their 90s and are Korean. Even in American Asians live 6 years longer than Whites and Hispanics live longer as well. The only two groups that don't are African Americans and Native Americans that were most suffered immensely in the history of our country. The essentials of pediatric nursing book also holds these same kinds of racial undertones. The pediatric professor did include readings from the Pearson book that did not overlook these racial biases and over generalizations. The majority of my professors were amazing and wonderful people I would be proud to know. Even the teacher that made the statement above had an excellent teaching style. I just didn't expect this to be taught at a university level and to find this snuck into "educational" materials.

I enjoyed TCC, a couple teachers were not the nicest.

I have had some outstanding professors and some that were just horrible.

I wish this campus cared more about their students. The teaching quality could be a lot better but many students and myself felt that we could've had better teachers. Reading from a power point isn't teaching us. We've had to teach ourselves and while it's doable, we should also be learning in class.

My experience was great, just sad that Tulsa Community College close the Interior Design Program. And the program was great with the exceptions of a couple of teachers that they got comfortable doing the glass via zoom and didn't want to meet in Person, being the class on person. I am a bit frustrated for that because I feel that the last group that we are graduating we don't accomplish all that the other graduating groups did on the past.

My overall experience was good. Returning to school after 23 years was pretty smooth, I anticipated more obstacles with online learning. After being in the workforce for decades though, I think there could be much more useful classes when it comes to the basics. I think a more realistic overhaul of general courses is needed.

None of my classes where offered in person and none of my online classes had meeting times. It was all on zybooks and it was automatically graded. I would have loved to have had more communication with my peers and professors. I taught myself while professors where paid to do nothing.

Nursing program instructors expect too much self-teaching of students. We pay them to teach us.

Online is hard if the teacher does not explain the topics in detail.

Please get rid of the Zybooks. This was the only negative experience I had as I did not feel as if I learned or took anything away from the classes that used these.

This was a pattern throughout all ADOBE software classes I took at TCC. This left most of our classmates falling behind and not on the same page as the instructor, most of the time. This causes unnecessary stress on students and should be taken seriously.

I found that Youtube and other online videos helped me fill in the blanks during these classes. I don't feel like the instructors cared if you were retaining the information, they cared more about the speed and the amount of material that was gone over. This was very disappointing to realize after taking the digital media course. I would give great warning to other students who were interested in the digital media program. I love digital media and hope to own my business where I help others and facilitate answers where others have left gaps. I'm thankful to get to further my education and hope for a better learning environment at OSU next semester.

I kept saying I did not want a refund, that I wanted the grades to change to W's and she just kept on about the refund. I have heard so many conflicting stories and information about all of it I would honestly rather let the lawyers sort it out.

Admissions is a very difficult department to work with

Be more flexible about students receiving Accessibility Resources.

Enrolling through TCC was a hassle, they lost my transcript from my other school and took almost a month to find it. I also made a plan with my advisor at the beginning of the semester to see if I had enough credits to graduate, and she said I did, but then at the end of the semester I was one credit hour short.

Great experience but I feel like my academic advisor changed tons of times

I enjoyed my time at TCC the only thing I didn't enjoy was not being able to visit with advising as much as I would have liked. You had to set up appointments and sometimes I was unable to, also the campus in Owasso does not offer much classes which was a real bummer.

I had a bad experience with academic advising. My first advisor was great, but she ended up taking a different job within TCC and could no longer be my advisor. Then, I got put with somebody else who was not available for MONTHS when I needed assistance then. I did the walk in advising several times but nobody was ever able to help any issues I had and they kept telling me to go to my assigned advisor which I couldn't. Then, when my advisors schedule opened up, I got another email saying I was being switched advisors again. Then this advisor was not available for weeks. I finally got on the phone with her and she informed me that it was her last day and I would be getting assigned ANOTHER advisor. This was so frustrating I was just getting tossed around by advisors. I also had another problem with Tulsa achieves. They were not paying for my school even though I did all the work for it and filled everything out. I contacted just about every office and each one said that there was nothing I could do and I would just have to pay for it myself. I had to contact a family friend who got it fixed for me immediately. This made me feel like everyone I had called just didn't care or was too lazy to try.

I had some poor guidance at the beginning of my first semester about IB credits transferring from my high school to my college transcript which messed up my initial GPA but I was able to recover. I also had a couple less than great professors, which was unfortunate, but I also had a bunch of really awesome ones too, so that was super sweet.

I think TCC should reinforce their security at night for the downtown location. The homeless population is growing and going to school at night is dangerous for students.

I was misinformed about multiple forms of paper work such as fasfa and graduation. I then provided the papers that I was told I needed, yet they were not filed and I had to do this 3 more times till they were filled properly.

I wish there was a more direct line to get advising help. Always seemed to get pushed back until someone had time.

Most of my experiences with TCC as a college, meaning financial aid, advising, etc have been hit and miss. But has improved since I started in 2017. Some of my advisors in the start of my education gave me bad advice for class enrollment and did not know the specifics to the Interpreting program which caused issues. However, improvements have been made outside of rude advisors from time to time especially, with Covid and getting an appointment on phone/zoom is hard and you get a random advisor who treats you like you are dumb. Only complaint, rude advisors at times/do not fix the problem/bad attitudes.

Please make seeing a advisor easier. Before COVID it was so nice please go back to that.
