Greetings TCC Students,

Yesterday was a historic day in Oklahoma with the passage of State Question 788, the Medical Marijuana Legalization Initiative. Despite the passage of State Question 788, the use, possession, sale, or distribution of marijuana (including medical marijuana and products containing marijuana) on any College owned or controlled property *is illegal and against TCC guidelines*. You cannot bring it on any TCC properties, smoke or consume it in any TCC parking lot or come to class or work under the influence.

Even though medical marijuana is now legal under state law, it is illegal under federal law. TCC receives federal funding and therefore must abide by the federal Drug Free Schools and Communities Act Amendments of 1989 and prohibit the use of marijuana. TCC must also abide by the federal Drug Free Workplace Act, which prohibits the unlawful manufacture, distribution, possession and use of illicit drugs and alcohol in the workplace. This includes medical marijuana.

Regardless of having a prescription for medical marijuana, any use on campus or during school hours is not allowed and will result in student disciplinary action if found to be used while at TCC (Please see attached guidelines).
